

HUMAN SERVICE INTERNSHIP SITES

The following internship placement descriptions are of agencies that may accept students. The list is not intended to be inclusive; other settings may become available. Students who may have "connections" in or desire other sites must consult with the Human Services Coordinator **before** approaching their sites.

NOTE: Settings focusing on alcoholism/chemical dependencies or young children require that students be enrolled in or have completed courses specific to those particular areas.

Early Childhood specific settings are indicated by EC. Settings appropriate for School-Aged emphasis interns are indicated by SA. Many SA settings are also appropriate as general internship sites.

Abraham House
Utica

This residential facility provides housing and support services to individuals with AIDS. The intern will assist the director and/or social worker in areas such as referrals, counseling, assessments, etc.

ACCESS - Adult Center for Comprehensive Educational and Support
Services
508 Second Street, Utica

ACCESS offers a holistic approach to meet client needs in the areas of counseling, case management, day care, basic education, alternative education, the job search, basic human needs and job training. Internships may be available in the above areas as well as in administrative services.

Addiction Crisis Center (OASAS licensed)
203 Rutger Street, Utica

Students will assist staff in providing linkages to needed services in the community in addition to providing immediate services for those with acute alcohol-related problems. This setting requires a student who is enrolled in or has completed an AS-designated course.

The intern assists counselors working with outpatients having drug, alcohol, and related problems. The intern may be exposed to group counseling, individual counseling, home visits, intake procedures, referrals, record-keeping, follow-ups, court visits and working with residents and outpatients. Flexible hours are required.

The intern may also assist in the community education/prevention

program. Programs are conducted for elementary and high school age children as well as adults and community groups or agencies.

An intern may also assist counselors working with residents having drug, alcohol and related problems. The intern will be involved in intake procedures, social and recreational activities, documentation, and house management.

The intern will have the opportunity to gain experience in a variety of areas including counseling, social work, case management, general office procedures, community relations, and specialized training in HIV/AIDS, confidentiality, the hotline, and direct services.

The student will assist staff who provide an intensive program designed to significantly increase the probability that students who are at risk of dropping out will instead complete high school. The school focuses on a goal-oriented academic program, affective issues, coping skills, and responsible decision-making.

Alzheimer's Coalition, RCIL
409 Columbia St., Utica

The agency provides services to families and individuals impacted by Alzheimer's. Services may include home visit assessments, linkage with needed services, supportive counseling, and developing educational workshops.

American Heart Association, Central New York Region
Lomond Place, Utica

The intern will assist staff in planning and promoting special events such as Jump Rope for Heart in area schools, complete program reports, and assist in planning

and implementing educational programs at work sites, hospitals and in the community.

American Red Cross

The intern would assist the Community Services staff in interviewing applicants and casework services. Components within Emergency Services include services to military, disaster services, and utility assistance programs. There are also opportunities to work with Ombudsmen at area Nursing homes.

ARC of Otsego County- Oneonta
ARC of Madison County

A variety of placements may be available depending upon the intern's interests and the agency's needs. ARC may offer internships in day treatment, community residences, pre-school programs (EC) and sheltered workshops. The intern will work with staff to supervise and teach adult clients daily living skills, help plan and carry out recreational activities and build social/communication skills. Each ARC offers programs throughout its geographic area. Day and evening hours may be available.

Ava Dorfman Senior Citizen Center
305 E. Locust, Rome

Outreach Program -The intern will work directly with the Coordinator of Outreach programs to assess the needs of senior citizens and to provide resource information and programs to meet those needs.

Senior Day Care - Students will assist in the programming of recreational and occupational activities for senior citizens from the local community. Case management, in-service training, and program development are required components of the internship placement.

Behavioral Health Partners
1750 Genesee St., Utica

Several agencies have joined this consortium of services to provide integrated services so that clients may have available comprehensive services. Interns will observe and/or assist counselors, chemical dependency counselors, social workers, behavior specialists, etc. as services are provided to the mentally ill, chemically dependent, and/or

behavior disordered.

Bethany House Nursing Home
800 W. Chestnut Street, Rome

The intern works with the social worker in providing services to residents. The intern is exposed to admission interviews, home visits, staffing, referrals, etc. Interns may also work within the activities department with individuals and small groups of residents.

Betsy Ross Health Related Facility
Rome

The intern works with the social worker in providing services to residents. The intern is exposed to admission interviews, home visits, staffing, referrals, etc. Interns may also work within the activities department with individuals and small groups of residents.

Big Brothers/Big Sisters Program
1020 Mary Street, Utica/Rome

Interns will assist the case manager in interviewing and matching children from single parent homes and adult companions, coordinate and attend joint events and help with the intergenerational program. The intern will also help plan informational sessions on child abuse, sex abuse, and drug/alcohol abuse and prevention. In addition, opportunity will be available to observe and participate in the many programs offered by UCP. See description under United Cerebral Palsy Center.

Boys and Girls Club of Utica -SA
755 Lansing Street Utica or
Hutchings Hall, York Street, Utica

The club is a youth citizenship and leadership development organization that provides services for boys and girls 6-18. The intern will assist staff in planning social and recreational activities and in providing supportive counseling for needy youngsters. Late afternoon/early evening hours needed.

Bridges – Madison County Council on Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services
Canastota

The intern will assist workers in programs to educate the general public on the prevention and treatment of alcohol and other drug abuse, dependency,

and compulsive disorders. Students may also assist in the drinking driver program, area employee assistance program (EAP) and information and referral services. This setting requires a student who is enrolled in or has completed an AS-designated course.

Bright Beginnings Day Care Center -EC
Elizabeth Street, Utica

Care is provided to children from 6 weeks up to 3 years old. Interns will assist caregivers in planning and implementing the program to meet the physical, social, cognitive, emotional and creative needs of these young children.

Canasota Middle School -SA

Catholic Charities
Utica and Rome, Fulton, Syracuse

Community Residences - Intern works with staff to supervise and teach adult clients daily living skills, help plan and carry out recreational activities and provide assistance in social/communication skills. Placements are available in residences serving the developmentally disabled, the mentally ill and recovering alcoholics. Student must be available late afternoon, evening and some Saturdays.

Runaway and Homeless Youth – Intern works with the caseworkers, clients, families, and host homes in providing short-term counseling and referrals for youth in crisis. Flexible hours helpful.

Young Parent's Program - Intern works with pregnant teens and teenage parents to assist in areas such as parenting skills, developmental needs of children, nutrition, community resources, etc.

Case Management - In this component of the Community Support System, interns will assist counselors in providing support services to the chronically mentally disabled.

Emergency Services - The intern will assist staff in providing direct services to people in need. In addition, the intern may have the opportunity to conduct interviews, do telephone intakes, make referrals, do monthly reports, and other related tasks.

Rutger Street and Genesee Street Community Residences (OASAS

licensed)

These residences for men and for women respectively provide services to recovering alcoholics who require residential services following in-patient treatment. Interns will participate in treatment planning, counseling, groups, teaching independent living skills, recreational activities and monitoring client progress.

Center for Addiction Recovery
Limberlost Road, Clinton

The center is dually certified by OASAS to provide assessment, evaluation, and treatment for individuals and families with problems related to alcohol and substance abuse or dependence. Along with traditional groups, the center offers stress management, relapse prevention, and women's recovery groups. The agency also provides adolescent and family programs, counseling for co-dependency and intensive outpatient services. The Center has satellite offices in the surrounding area including Cazenovia. This placement requires a student who is enrolled in or has completed AS-designated courses.

Central Association for The Blind
Kent Street, Utica

Rehabilitation Services - Interns will assist staff in mobility training, assessment of specialized equipment and preparation for work training of visually-impaired clients.

Supportive Employment - This component of Central Association for The Blind establishes community work sites where visually impaired clients may receive on-the-job training. Individual assessment, job seeking skills and job coaching are also integral components of this program.

Children's Services - The intern will assist staff who work with pre-school children with visual disabilities, as well as their families. Educational activities, rehabilitation, and individualized services are provided.

Case Management - Case Management positions may also be available.

Central New York Developmental Disabilities Service Office
Various locations

Mentally retarded and developmentally disabled clients participate in day treatment programs and live in area community residences. Interns will assist staff in carrying out these related programs. The residence program is a later afternoon/early evening placement. The day treatment program

works well for the Tuesday and Thursday participation. Case Management internships are also available.

Central New York Psychiatric Center
Marcy

The intern will work under close supervision and will be instructed in the multidisciplinary approach to treatment, which includes Social Work, Psychology and Psychological Testing, Recreational and Occupational Therapy, Psych-Rehab and group modalities. The student will be working with the acute/chronically mentally ill inmate referred from the maximum-security prisons throughout the State of New York.

Charles T. Sitrin Home
Upper Tilden Avenue, New Hartford

The intern may work with the social workers in providing services to residents. The intern is exposed to admission interviews, home visits, staffing, and family contacts.

The intern is assigned residents to work with on a one-to-one basis. Interns may also work within the activities department with individual and small groups of residents.

The Day Care Center (EC) serves children from 6 weeks to 5 years old. The intern will be given opportunities to plan activities for children on an individual, small and large group basis to enhance physical, social, cognitive and emotional growth. Assignments are available mornings or afternoons.

The Development Office is involved in grant writing, public relations, and fund raising. The intern will also make community contacts, attend staff meetings, and participate in related research. Placements are available mornings and/or afternoons.

Adult Day Health Services provides day care for the geriatric individual who maintains an independent life-style in a home setting, but possibly needs assistance in nutrition, self-administration of medication, physical or occupational therapy development, or perhaps needs social interaction with others. The intern could assist in all facets of the program.

GAN KAVOD is a residential facility serving the aging who are mentally retarded. Interns will participate in staff meetings, assist consumers in developing daily living skills and in provide activities, etc. Late afternoon and early evening hours work best for the intern.

Occupational therapists serve all ages and individuals with a variety of

needs/disabilities in a state-of-the-art facility. Only students highly interested in OT should consider requesting this site.

Children and Family Services -SA
State Office Building, Utica

Interns will accompany and assist caseworkers in the fields as they work towards the rehabilitation of delinquent youth. Field experiences may include home visits, foster placements, visits to job sites, detention facilities, etc. Facilitating life skills training classes for youth may also be incorporated into the internship. Interns must have flexible hours and be self-directed.

Children's Museum -SA
311 Main Street
Utica

The intern will assist the education staff in preparing and implementing programs in area schools and at the museum for all ages of children. Topics may include history, artifacts, electromagnetism, mechanics, chemics, optics, learning centers, honeybees, dinosaurs, arachnids, Native Americans, snow, pilgrims, animal tracks, potato activities, whale watch, etc. Daily activities are provided each morning in Playspace at the museum. Students may assist staff in developing and introducing arts and crafts activities read stories or develop other related activities for young children.

Clinton Child Care Center -EC
Hamilton College Campus, Clinton

The intern will work with either toddlers or preschoolers. Opportunity is given to work with children on a small group and individual basis and plan lessons and activities that will enhance social, intellectual and motor skill development. Clinton Child Care Center is open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday. Assignments are available mornings or afternoons each day of the week.

Clinton Elementary School -SA
Chenango Avenue, Clinton

The intern may work in grades K, 1, 2 or 3 as an assistant to the teacher. Interns will have an opportunity to plan and implement a variety of lessons; activity may be on a one-to-one or small group basis.

Clinton United Methodist Church -EC
105 Utica Road, Clinton

The intern will work with 3 and 4 year olds. Opportunity is given to work with children on a small group and individual basis and plan lessons and activities that will enhance social, intellectual and physical development. Placements are available mornings only.

Community Health and Behavioral Services
Genesee St., Utica

The intern will assist case managers in making provision for needed services to individuals with mental health and drug- related issues.

Compeer
Genesee Street, Utica

The organization seeks and matches volunteers with individuals who have experienced mental health problems and are transitioning to living in the community. The intern will assist in recruiting and interviewing volunteers. In addition, the intern will help plan and implement social and recreational activities for volunteers and the individuals for whom they provide support.

Cosmopolitan Center -SA
470 Whitesboro Street, Utica

Youth Program - The intern will assist staff in providing supportive counseling and planning and implementing social and recreational activities for children 5-18 years. Later afternoon and/or early evening hours are required.

Eastern Star Day Care Center -EC/SA
Route 69, Oriskany

The intern will work with children from 6 weeks to 6 years old. Opportunity is given to work with children on a small group and individual basis and plan lessons and activities that will enhance social, intellectual and motor skill development. Eastern Star Day Care Center is open from 6:45 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Assignments are available mornings or afternoons each day of the week. A school-age child care program is conducted Monday through Friday at Oriskany Elementary School in the late afternoon. Students will assist in planning activities for this age level.

Eden Park Nursing Home
1800 Butterfield, Utica

The intern works with the social worker in providing services to residents. The intern is exposed to admission interviews, home visits, staffing, referrals, etc. Interns may also work within the activities department with individuals and small groups of residents.

Emmaus House
1215 Kemble Street, Utica

This residence provides shelter to women and children in need. The intern would assist the director in planning and implementing constructive time with children in the areas of art, reading, etc. and individualized positive interaction time with children. There would be opportunity to interact with women in crisis as a friendly listener and/or activities leader.

Epilepsy Services
United Cerebral Palsy
Stark Street, Utica

This agency offers support and advocacy services to those with epilepsy and also provides community educational programs on epilepsy. The intern would assist staff in the following services provided by the agency- support groups for adults and teens, information and referral services, educational inservice programs and advocacy on behalf of clients.

Family Advocacy Center
Cosby Manor Road, Deerfield

This agency gives support to individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. Through advocacy and life planning, assistance is given to assure that clients and families receive appropriate services and have the quality of life that the non-handicapped populations enjoys. A Case Management internship is also available.

Family Nursery School -EC
New Hartford Methodist United Church
105 Genesee Street, New Hartford

Family Nurturing Center, Inc. -EC/SA
285 Genesee Street, Utica

The intern would work with children of different ages in a structured therapeutic program teaching nurturing skills through play activities.

Opportunity is also available to work with families. Training is required in the semester previous to entering the internship. Internship could be mornings and/or evenings. Flexible hours are preferred. At the Family Place, the Nurturing Center sponsors a drop-in preschool program that combines children's programming along with opportunities for parents to participate in support groups and parenting workshops.

Family Services of the Mohawk Valley

Rome

The intern will assist staff in Emergency Services in conducting intake screening, completing required documentation, and in making the referral(s) determination for counseling, Food Bank services, Emergency Traveler Services, and linkages to other community agencies. Placements may also be available in the PINS Diversion Program. Case Management internships are also available.

First Presbyterian Church Nursery School -EC
108 W. Court Street, Rome

Gambling Information and Counseling Services
1411 Genesee St., Utica

This agency provides services to clients and family members having issues related to gambling. Interns will observe and participate in assessment, education and counseling.

Hamilton County Community Services
Indian Lake

The intern will assist case managers in making provision for needed services to individuals with mental health and drug-related issues.

Harmony House
Main Street, Herkimer

The intern works with members of the psycho-social club which is modeled after Fountain House in New York City. The members are deinstitutionalized adults. The purpose of the club is to provide social support, as well as employment and educational activities for its members.

Head Start
Various locations in Utica, Rome, Herkimer
New York Mills, Camden, Barneveld, Sauquoit,

Verona Beach, West Winfield and Boonville

Educational Component -(EC) - The intern works with pre-school, culturally-deprived children. There is opportunity to assist the teachers and plan and implement a variety of lessons and activities to meet children's needs. A doctor's statement of general health is required.

Family Advocate Component; Mental Health Component – The intern works with the family service outreach workers in providing services to Head Start families. The intern is exposed to home visits, Head Start classrooms, administrative tasks, and referrals and participates in the planning and implementation of support groups.

Health and Hope Program
Rome Family Y
301 W. Bloomfield, Rome

The intern will have practical "hands-on" experience with physically frail or handicapped elderly clients. They will work with client assessment and evaluation, community promotion, record keeping, preparation of program reports, individual and family counseling, recreational and occupational therapy, and referrals.

Heritage Home
1657 Sunset Avenue, Utica

The intern works with the activities department and has extensive one-to-one contact with the elderly residents. Activities include crafts, letter writing, bowling, cooking, etc.

Herkimer BOCES -SA
Herkimer

The intern chooses from a variety of settings including self-contained classes, individual therapies, or extracurricular activities. Interns work on an individual and group basis with students assigned to various programs. BOCES students range in age from 3 to 21 and have a variety of handicapping conditions including mental retardation, behavior disorders, speech disorders, neurological impairments or physical impairments. Classes are located at BOCES center and individual public buildings. Specific placements include:

- classes for developmentally delayed young children

- classes for the mentally retarded
- classes for multiply handicapped
- classes for behavior disorders (adjustment classes)
- physical education
- speech therapy
- occupational therapy

Herkimer County Chemical Dependency Services
Route 5, Herkimer

This agency serves clients with alcohol and substance abuse related problems. Interns will observe and participate in assessment, education, and counseling. This setting requires a student who is enrolled in or has completed an AS-designated course.

Hope House
130 Eagle Street, Utica

Hope House provides one meal daily to all adults and children who ask. The intern will assist in recruiting volunteers, providing orientation, soliciting donations, and in the routine daily tasks involved with meal preparation and serving. Interns will also assist in linking consumers with needed community services.

Hospice Care, Inc.
Middle Settlement Road, New Hartford

Hospice provides support services to the terminally ill and their families. The intern would participate in interdisciplinary group meetings, special projects, home visits. Orientation and training is required as part of the internship.

House of the Good Shepherd -SA
Champlin Ave., New Hartford

This is a facility offering educational programs and residential living areas for children experiencing adjustment difficulties.

School (on grounds) - Intern will work with students on an individual and

small group basis in the academic and recreational areas.

Residential Treatment Center - Intern will work with children in a tutoring, problem solving, and/or recreational capacity. This is an afternoon or early evening placement.

Residential Treatment Facility - The intern will assist staff in providing services to chronically mentally ill children 5-18. The intern will assist in tutoring and in planning and implementing social and recreational activities. Intern must be motivated and self-directed and have a high academic Grade Point Average (GPA).

Other programs for consideration include: Group Emergency Foster Care, Non-secure Detention, Families Foremost Program, and Quality Improvement.

The intern will assist counselors in helping clients to develop skills necessary to maintain a job in this environment. Interns will be involved in staff meetings, networking, referrals, counseling, and teaching of skills relevant to maintaining a job.

Infant and Toddler Day Care Center -EC
Herkimer BOCES, Herkimer
BOCES, Middle Settlement Road, New Hartford

This program serves children of secondary students, BOCES staff, and community members. The intern will assist the caregivers in planning and implementing a program to meet the needs of children.

Insight House
Whitesboro St., Utica

The intern assists counselors working with outpatients having drug, alcohol, and related problems. The intern may be exposed to group counseling, individual counseling, home visits, intake procedures,

referrals, record-keeping, follow-ups, court visits and working with residents and outpatients. Flexible hours preferred.

The intern may also assist in the community education/prevention program. Programs are conducted for elementary and high school age children as well as adults and community groups or agencies.

An intern may also assist counselors working with residents having drug, alcohol and related problems. The intern will be involved in intake procedures, social and recreational activities, documentation, and house management. Hours for this placement can be afternoons or evenings.

The intern will assist staff in the various component programs offered for either preschool age children (18 months to 4 years), school age children, young adults, seniors, and joint parent-child activities.

Katherine Luther Home
Clinton, New York

This is a new three-unit facility at the Martin Luther Complex. Interns are offered the opportunity to work with the Activities Director in providing a variety of treatment specific activities to the Frail and Elderly residents on the Gordon Unit. The Alzheimer/Dementia residents on the Bryant Unit and the Head Trauma/MS residents on the Saul Unit (young adults).

Kiddie Kampus Day Care Center -EC
Mohawk Valley Community College, Utica

This day care center serves children from 3 to 5 years old. Both single and double internships are available. The intern will assist caregivers in planning and implementing a program to meet the needs of children.

Kids Oneida
Genesee St., Utica

Through the use of intensive, flexible community services, Kids Oneida diverts children with serious emotional disturbances from out-of-home institutional placements and/or shortens the time that children remain in such placements. Interns will be exposed to direct case management services and working within the larger service system. Limited placement restricted to motivated, self-directed interns with a high academic GPA.

Learning Disabilities Association -SA
Columbia Street, Utica

The LDA provides assessment, support, advocacy, and educational programs for individuals with disabilities. The intern will assist in this effort.

Lewis County Chemical Dependency Clinic
Lowville

This agency serves clients with alcohol and substance abuse related problems. Interns will observe and participate in assessment, education, and counseling. This setting requires a student who is enrolled in or has completed an AS-designated course.

Liberty Resources
Liberty Street, and other locations in Oneida area

Arise - (case management) - Interns will assist case managers in making provision for needed services to individuals with disabilities and/or chemical dependency issues. Internship placements are available in Oneida and possibly in Syracuse.

Venture House - The intern will assist case managers in providing services to mentally ill, chemical abusers.

Victims of Violence - The intern may have the opportunity to participate in any or all of the following: interviewing, group work, supportive counseling, training, direct services, community networking, community education, completion of statistics, answering the crisis phone, making referrals and otherwise assisting victims of rape and women and children who are victims of abuse. Opportunities to participate in training sessions, area meetings, and the planning process are usually available. Flexible

hours preferred.

Cedar House - The intern works with members of the psycho-social club which is modeled after Fountain House in New York City. The members are deinstitutionalized adults. The purpose of the club is to provide social support, as well as recreational and educational activities for its members.

Maxwell House - is a halfway house for recovering alcoholics. The intern will assist staff in providing supportive counseling and social, recreational, and educational activities and in helping residents to develop appropriate daily living skills. Placements are available late afternoon and evening. Flexible hours are preferred.

Loretto Utica Center
Kemble Street, Utica

The intern works with the social worker in providing services to residents. The intern is exposed to admission interviews, home visits, staffing referrals, etc. Interns may also work within the activities department with individuals and small groups of residents.

Madison County Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment Program (ADAPT) Wampsville (OASAS licensed)

The intern will assist staff in providing counseling, day treatment, and educational programs to individuals and families with chemical dependency concerns.

Madison County Office of the Aging
Wampsville

The intern is involved in assessing the needs of senior citizens and providing information and referral to programs to meet those needs. Participation in case management, in-service training, outreach program development, and nutrition are often components of this internship placement.

Madison-Oneida BOCES -SA
Spring Road, Verona

The intern chooses from a variety of settings including self-contained classes, individual therapies, or extracurricular activities. Interns work on an individual and group basis with students assigned to various programs. BOCES students range in age from 3 to 21 and have a variety of handicapping conditions including mental retardation, behavior disorders,

speech disorders, neurological impairments or physical impairments. Most classes are at BOCES. Some classes may be located in Vernon, Verona or Sherrill in public buildings. Specific placements

include:

- classes for developmentally delayed young children
- classes for the mentally retarded
- classes for multiply handicapped
- classes for behavior disorders (adjustment classes)
- physical education
- speech therapy
- occupational therapy
- social work
- Eastern Studies Program - selected high school Rome-students participate in this program around the Japanese culture. The intern will assist the classroom teacher in planning and implementing instruction centered on Japanese culture, history, language, etc.

Mancuso Agency (OASAS licensed)
Utica and Oneida

The intern will assist staff in providing counseling (individual and group) and educational programs to individuals and families with chemical dependency concerns.

This agency has satellite offices in surrounding areas including Oneida and Waterville

This setting requires a student who is enrolled in or has completed AS-designated courses.

Marcy Correctional Facility

Interns desiring administrative experience may work with the director in areas such as budget, staffing programs, reports, computer programs, arranging in-service programs, and attending community meetings.

Family Advocacy Center - Advocacy services are provided to victims of sexual abuse and their families. The intern may be exposed to court hearings, crisis counseling, interagency meetings, interviewing clients, support in the hospital or police setting and completing required local and state documentation. Flexible hours helpful.
