Greetings from the MVCC Foundation!

As we reflect on another year of growth and success, I want to highlight one of the most impactful ways our community continues to support students: through scholarships. These vital funds open doors for students who may otherwise find higher education beyond their reach. Thanks to your generosity, we've made incredible strides in helping students pursue their dreams.

In the 2023-24 academic year alone, we awarded \$459,635 in scholarships through 411 individual awards, supporting 208 students. This represents a 14% increase in scholarship funding, a 10.7% increase in the number of awards, and an 11.2% rise in the number of students served. Behind these numbers are the lives of students whose academic paths have been transformed by your contributions.



I'm excited to share that 10 new scholarships were established this year, bringing the total number of scholarships available to 139. Over the last three years, 19 new scholarship funds have been created — a testament to the unwavering support of our alumni and donors.

2024 ALUMNUS OF MERIT WINNER: Marianne Buttenschon 28

A career-long educator and lifelong learner, MVCC Dean Emerita Dr. Marianne Buttenschon '81 has always held a deep passion for learning.

Her commitment to education and community engagement was especially influenced by her father, the late William B. Goodman, a dedicated public servant and U.S. History teacher at Whitesboro Middle School. Her passion is evident in her advocacy for education, especially for community colleges like MVCC.

"My academic journey started at MVCC as a criminal justice major," Buttenschon says. "I went from student intern to academic dean." Buttenschon, recently re-elected to a fourth term on the New York State Assembly representing the 119th District, is the 2024 recipient of the MVCC Alumni of Merit Award, an annual honor that recognizes alumni who have contributed to the improvement of our community, helped the College, and demonstrated professional leadership reflecting MVCC's mission of student success and community involvement.

Before her work in the Assembly, Buttenschon dedicated nearly 30 years to MVCC. She started in 1990 as an adjunct instructor, advancing through various roles until her appointment as an Academic Dean, a position she held until 2018. Throughout her MVCC career, Buttenschon created new learning opportunities intentionally designed to prepare students for the workforce through innovative partnerships and programs. Her achievements include establishing the fire and police academies, expanding nationally accredited cybersecurity programs, and creating professional development initiatives.

"There are endless opportunities a community college like MVCC can provide — the staff, the faculty, the support you receive are incomparable," she says. "As an Assembly member, I often need experts to weigh in on important issues, and that expertise is just a phone call away with the innovative thinking at a community college."

Buttenschon graduated from MVCC in 1981 with an associate degree in Criminal Justice. She went on to earn a bachelor's degree in Public Justice from SUNY Institute of Technology, a master's degree in Public Policy from Binghamton University, and a Doctorate of Education in Organizational Leadership from Northeastern University. In addition to her educational career, Buttenschon and her husband, Don, have operated the Buttenschon Christmas Tree Farm in the Town of Marcy for over 30 years.


MVCC Expands Recognition of Outstanding Alumni with Two New Awards

In 2024, MVCC expanded its recognition of outstanding alumni with the introduction of two new awards — the Distinguished Alumni Award and the Young Alumni Award. These annual honors complement the College's long-standing Alumni of Merit Award, which has celebrated graduates for their professional achievements and community contributions for over 50 years. MVCC hopes these new awards will inspire current students and graduates alike, showcasing the wide-ranging paths to success that begin at the College.



2024 Distinguished Alumni Award - Howard Potter '10

Howard Potter '10 received MVCC's 2024 Distinguished Alumni Award, which recognizes alumni who have made significant contributions to their industry while demonstrating a commitment to MVCC's values throughout their life and career. For over 20 years, Potter and his wife, Amanda, have been operating A&P Master Images in Utica, offering services in graphic design, screen printing, embroidery, sublimation, vinyl graphics, and promotional items. Dedicated to the local community, Potter provides internships to area students and recently donated 50 winter hats and 50 pairs of gloves to MVCC's College-Community-Connection Office. Potter's achievements have earned him numerous accolades, including the 2023 United Way's 100 Heroes Award; the 2020 Best of the Best Award for local print shop, apparel, and sign company; the 2019 New York State Senate Empire Award; and the 2016 Genesis 40 Under 40 Award. Potter serves on the advisory board for Wearables magazine, and A&P's work has been published in 50 national industry magazines. The company also has won seven national industry awards, including the "Top Shop" award and the New York State U.S. Small Business Award.



2024 Young Alumni Award - Julius Blackshear Jr. '15

Julius Blackshear Jr. '15 received MVCC's 2024 Young Alumni Award, which recognizes alumni who graduated within the last 10 years, have emerged as early leaders in their careers and communities, and who embody MVCC's values. Blackshear holds an associate degree in Computer Aided Drafting from MVCC and currently works as a drafting technician for National Grid. He is also the owner of Visionary Vending, a regional vending machine business he launched in 2020 with the support of MVCC's thINCubator. Before joining National Grid and becoming an entrepreneur, Blackshear spent four years as a senior engineering technician with the New York State Department of Transportation and spent several years working with children in grades 4-7 at Thea Bowman House. Blackshear, who attended Thea Bowman House as a child, now serves on its Board of Directors.

Dr. Kyle Angelicola-Richardson '10, Sports Medicine

Orthopedic Surgeon, Rome Health

Dr. Kyle Angelicola-Richardson '10 recently joined Rome Health as an Orthopedic Surgeon, and his path to success started right here at MVCC.

Richardson first chose to attend MVCC because he was looking to save money and have a good academic experience. "I was happy to find out it was even more than I expected," says the 2010 graduate of the Liberal Arts & Sciences: Sports Medicine degree program. "I was very impressed with the sciences there. I had great experiences in Anatomy & Physiology and Chemistry, which prepared me well for the next four years of college and medical school."





After graduating from MVCC, Richardson went on to earn his bachelor's degree at St. John's University in Queens and his Doctor of Medicine at SUNY Upstate Medical University in Syracuse. He is now an Orthopedic Surgeon at Rome Health, specializing in orthopedic and hand surgery.

While at MVCC, Richardson was captain of the Baseball Team and was named NJCAA Student-Athlete of the Year in 2010. He also was a member of the Phi Theta Kappa honor society. He says he is still grateful for the support and mentorship he received as a student. "All the people I met at MVCC have this open-door policy and really have a different attitude toward students than many other places. They understand where we're coming from and understand how to take care of us in a different way," he says. "When I moved on to St. John's University, I wanted to pass on what I experienced in mentorship at MVCC. Now I spend a lot of time helping people figure out the path to reach their goals, whether that's medicine or something else that they're really passionate about."

Nick Gelfuso '21, Engineering Science

Engineer, Pursuit Aerospace

Nick Gelfuso, a 2021 graduate of our Engineering Science program, is now an engineer at Pursuit Aerospace.

After graduating from MVCC, Gelfuso transferred to Clarkson University, which he says was a smooth and seamless process. 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Dr. Jennifer Boulanger

Professor and Dean Emerita Dr. Jennifer Boulanger began her career at MVCC in 1987 as interim instructor of English. The following year, she transitioned to the College's Learning Center, working for five years as the full-time Writing Tutor and, later, as Learning Center Coordinator. These roles in

the Learning Center afforded her the opportunity to work with a richly diverse student population. As she discovered an affinity for working with refugee students, Boulanger expanded her teaching repertoire to include a variety of ESL classes.

After working for a time at a neighboring community college, Boulanger returned to MVCC in 2007 as Assistant Dean for Student Affairs. In this role, she oversaw the Dual Credit Program and was instrumental in achieving its accreditation through the National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships. She also supervised key programs supporting student success and college readiness, including STEP, CSTEP, and Upward Bound.

In 2009, Boulanger was promoted to Dean of the Center for Language and Learning Design. Among her responsibilities

was oversight of the College Learning Center, Honors Program, developmental education, English as a Second Language, world languages, childhood and adolescent education programs, sign language interpretation, and College Seminar (now known as College Foundations). Her dedication to excellence in teaching was manifested in the support she provided the faculty in her Center, always striving to share empowering and encouraging feedback, whether in writing or in day-to-day interchange. An advocate for the LGBTQ+ community, Boulanger volunteered for the Safe Space Committee and was among the first team of in-house trainers. She also wrote portions of several grants, including the successful Title III grant that enabled the transformation of the Learning Center to the current-day Mandia Family Learning Commons.

A champion for the Utica's refugee community, Boulanger was appointed to the Board of Directors of The Center in 2009, having served as President, Vice President, and Secretary. She currently chairs The Center's Community Development Committee. Additionally, Boulanger is Vice President of the Board of Whitney's Legacy, a foundation dedicated to supporting and empowering women and addressing the needs of the underserved.

A gifted writer, Boulanger has authored essays on a range of topics. Her work has been featured in *Chalkbeat, The New York Daily News, Syracuse.com*, and the *Daily Sentinel*. Her forthcoming book, *A Song for Olaf*, will be published in 2025.



Dr. Marianne Buttenschon

Dean Emerita Dr. Marianne Buttenschon has dedicated her life to public service, education, and community development. She began her career as an adjunct faculty member at MVCC in 1990 and progressed to Assistant Professor by 2000. Buttenschon's leadership skills quickly emerged, leading to her

appointment as Head of the Department of Social Sciences and Criminal Justice in 2004. From 2009 to 2016, she served as Dean of the Center for Social Sciences, Business, and Information Sciences, followed by her role as Dean of the Institute of Emergency Preparedness and Public Service from 2016 until 2018.

In addition to her administrative career, Buttenschon and her husband, Don, have operated the Buttenschon Christmas Tree Farm in Marcy for over 35 years. She also served as Whitestown Court Clerk from 1983 to 2018.

Buttenschon was elected to the New York State Assembly in 2018, representing the 119th District, which includes Utica, Rome, Whitestown, Marcy, Deerfield, and Floyd. In her role as Assemblywoman, she serves on several key committees, including the Education, Higher Education, Veterans, Economic Development, and Agriculture committees, and she is Chair of the Agriculture and Exports Committee. Additionally, Buttenschon is a member of the Asian-Pacific Task Force, Legislative Women's Caucus, Puerto Rican/Hispanic Task Force, Task Force on Women's Issues, American-Irish Legislators Society, and the New York Conference of Italian-American Legislators. She also was selected as the Assembly's representative on the Interoperable and Emergency Communications Board by Carl Heastie, Speaker of the New York State Assembly.

A lifelong resident of the Mohawk Valley, Buttenschon has tirelessly advocated for her constituents and the importance of education, particularly community colleges like MVCC. Her 28 years at MVCC, combined with her public service, have positioned her as a strong and genuine leader, known for putting the needs of her community above party politics. A steadfast supporter of police, fire, and emergency services, she consistently shows appreciation for their sacrifices.



Dennis Rahn

Administrator Emeritus Dennis B. Rahn retired in 2011 after more than 20 impactful years at MVCC, serving as both Director of Student Activities and Director of Student Engagement and Outreach. Since his retirement, Rahn has continued to serve the College as an adjunct professor, achieving 40+ years of

service to MVCC. A key figure in the development of student engagement at MVCC, Rahn was instrumental in helping the College recognize the importance of out-of-classroom opportunities for student growth. His leadership in this area helped lay the foundation for MVCC's vibrant student engagement culture and student government structure that exists today.

In his career, Rahn played a role in how the mandatory student activity fee would be managed and structured. His work around the funding of intercollegiate athletics, student clubs, and eventually part of the College's Cultural Committee, through this fee, ensured their proper support. Additionally, the work that Dennis did in helping to develop a vibrant student engagement and government helped to seed some of the most important elements of our campus today.

Rahn's contributions extended beyond administration. He is a dedicated adjunct professor and part of the team that developed the first grant to serve adult students through Adult Student Services. His influence on the campus is far-reaching, touching everything from student government to cultural events and co-curricular transcripts, as well as a branch of the College's shared governance system.

In recognition of his professional contributions, Rahn received the 1997 MVCC Excellence in Professional Service Award and the 1998 SUNY Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Professional Service. His work helped to foster collaboration across all divisions of the College, and his commitment to student development continues to shape MVCC's culture.

MVCC HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2024



Penny Trojan

Professor Penny Trojan retired after a distinguished 45-year career as a full-time faculty member and adjunct instructor in MVCC's Physical Education and Athletics Department. Throughout her extensive tenure, Trojan taught a wide variety of service activity courses on both MVCC's

Utica and Rome campuses, including basketball and tennis classes for Physical Education majors, while also playing a key role in developing the Coaching Certification classes and a Coaching Manual alongside a co-author.

Trojan coached basketball for 13 years (prior to MVCC's participation in the NJCAA), achieving a .534 winning percentage. Her team secured a championship in the 1975-76 season and a runner-up finish in 1976-77 within the WJCSO conference. Additionally, she served as head

coach for the Women's Tennis program for 25 years — 13 of which were pre-NJCAA — leading her teams through both the WJCSO and NJCAA Region III conferences, achieving numerous accolades.

Beyond coaching, Trojan contributed to the College in various administrative roles, serving as Senate Secretary, providing student advisement at the Rome campus, and acting as a Commencement Marshall. Her dedication to teaching earned Trojan the MVCC Excellence in Teaching Award in 1996 and the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Excellence in 1997. She was also recognized with the NJCAA Region III Service Award.

Trojan's involvement extended well beyond the College, with notable contributions to the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (Section III) and the Utica Board of Officials for Girls Sports, as well as officiating for high school and college basketball, softball, and volleyball. She also held leadership roles, including President of the Utica Board of Officials and President of New York State Officials for Girls/Women's Basketball.







PARTNER MODOVOLO SEES PROJECT TAKE FLIGHT

MVCC's thINCubator is excited to announce some big news from one of its incubated companies — Modovolo.

Modovolo is a Mohawk Valley startup that is re-imagining what a drone can be with its Modovolo Lift, a modular, limitlessly configurable drone platform. Using a truly unique design, the Lift can be optimized for long flight times or payload weights to create the right drone for the right mission.

thINCubator has been a partner of Modovolo for over two years as it developed its technology, the prototype of which was just unveiled to the public this summer. Since then, Modovolo has closed its first round of funding and demoed a drone with a successful test flight in front of partners and investors.

Most recently, thINC and Modovolo applied for and secured a manufacturing grant from FuzeHub to provide funding for their first manufacturing cell right here in the Mohawk Valley.

MVCC RAISES \$133,771 THROUGH MV GIVES FOR PROPOSED DENTAL HYGIENE PROGRAM

In September, the MVCC Foundation participated in the Community Foundation's third annual Mohawk Valley Gives campaign, raising \$133,771 from 159 donors for the College's proposed Dental Hygiene program. MVCC was the thirdhighest earner of the campaign's 323 participating non-profit organizations and the only organization in the top three that did not receive a six- or seven-figure gift.

This successful campaign, which was generously matched 2:1 by the UpMobility Foundation (up to \$66,000), has helped close the funding gap for the proposed Dental Hygiene program, which includes plans to build a clinic on the garden level of MVCC's Rome Campus. Additionally, all dollars raised for the clinic will be matched 1:1 by the State University of New York (SUNY). MVCC's proposed Dental Hygiene program will equip students with the knowledge and handson experience needed to become skilled dental hygienists, prepared to enhance oral health in our community. It will be the only program of its kind between Albany and Rochester and will also offer free dental care to the community.

Additional funders and supporters of the proposed program include the Fifth District Dental Society, the New York State Dental Foundation, the Rome Community Foundation, and the City of Rome. The clinic is expected to open in the fall of 2026.





Foundation Awards Nearly \$460,000 in Scholarships at Dinner Sponsored by Strategic Financial Services



On May 9, the MVCC Foundation honored scholarship recipients at the 2024 Scholarship Awards Dinner and Ceremony, sponsored by Strategic Financial Services. The event recognizes the achievements of scholarship recipients and the generosity of the many donors who make these scholarships possible. The MVCC Foundation offers 139 scholarships in a variety of disciplines; every scholarship fund was created for a personal reason, standing as an enduring legacy of MVCC alumni, faculty, staff, students, loved ones, and local organizations. Between the Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 semesters, 411 scholarships were awarded to 208 individual students totaling \$459,635. This is an increase of 14% over last year! Thank you to event sponsor Strategic Financial Services, whose support of this important event ensures the Foundation can further focus its funding on helping each and every student pay for their college education.

HERE ARE HIGHLIGHTS OF SOME OF OUR NEWEST SCHOLARSHIPS:

Elaine M. Falvo Healthcare Scholarship

This scholarship was established by Elaine M. Falvo to support students pursuing a career in healthcare. It will be given annually to an MVCC student who has attained high academic achievement, demonstrated a strong work ethic, and is committed to community involvement/service. Elaine M. Falvo has served on the MVCC Board of Trustees since her appointment in 1988, having been consecutively appointed by three governors. She has served as chair twice, from 1993-96 and 2010-13, and was vice chair from 1991-92. Prior to retirement, Falvo served as the chief financial officer and treasurer of H.J. Brandeles Corp. of Utica, a mechanical contractor. Through knowledge gained while employed there, Falvo was a leader in the building of three major facilities at MVCC. She has been a member of several other local boards, including New Hartford Board of Education and the board of Faxton Hospital, from which she has been able to further MVCC's mission of helping students succeed, especially in the area's growing career fields. During her 35+ years as a trustee, Falvo has received several awards, including the Donald M. Mawhinney, Jr., Trustee Leadership Award, the Marvin A. Rapp Award for Distinguished Trustee Service, a Distinguished Service Award from the Association of Community College Trustees, and a 25-Year Leadership Award from the MVCC Board of Trustees.

Pathways to Success Scholarship

Endowed by the Fiori-Blanchfield family, the Pathway to Success Scholarship was created by William Blanchfield, Ph.D., and Joan Fiori Blanchfield, Ph.D., who love learning and teaching. The couple believes a college education has the power to open doors for those who have the opportunity to complete. This bi-annual award will be given to one incoming or returning student who is enrolled full- or part-time in any degree seeking program.



MVCC Retiree Legacy Scholarship

The MVCC Retiree Legacy Scholarship was established and endowed through the generosity of MVCC Retirees. For at least eight decades, the legacy and impact of MVCC Faculty & Staff have supported, educated, and inspired thousands of students, creating an alumni network of over 55,000 individuals. In alignment with MVCC's vision of transforming lives through learning, this full-tuition scholarship was created to eliminate financial barriers to education. It is awarded annually to a deserving MVCC returning adult student who meets the eligibility criteria and exemplifies dedication and academic excellence. Through this scholarship, MVCC Retirees continue to support the College mission and the success of its students.

Reverend William S. Baker Memorial Scholarship

The Reverend William S. Baker was raised and educated in Rome, N.Y., and was a graduate of Rome Free Academy and St. Bernard's Seminary in Rochester, N.Y. In 1955, Father Baker was ordained a Catholic Priest at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Syracuse, N.Y., and for 50 years, he dedicated his life to serving numerous parish communities. This scholarship was established in his memory and will support students with a GPA of 3.0 or higher who have demonstrated a commitment to community involvement and/ or service. Preference will be given to a graduate of Notre Dame Junior Senior High School.

Tuthill Scholarship in Nursing

The Tuthill Scholarship in Nursing was established in April 2024 by William and Karin Tuthill. The Tuthills were inspired to establish this scholarship when Karin was cared for by a licensed practical nurse with the intention and drive to return to college to obtain her RN. This scholarship is for returning adult students majoring in the Nursing program who have a passion for the field and who demonstrate a caring heart.

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MVCC Celebrates 5-Year Naming Sponsorship from Scalzo, Zogby & Wittig, Inc.

In March 2024, MVCC announced a five-year naming sponsorship from Scalzo, Zogby & Wittig, Inc., for its College-Community-Connection (C3) program. College-Community-Connection, sponsored by Scalzo, Zogby & Wittig, Inc., partners with local agencies to assist students facing barriers outside the classroom so they can focus on completing their academic goals.

C3 was used by 731 Individual students in Fall of 2023 and 802 individual students in the Spring of 2024. On average, each individual student visited C3 for services approximately 10 times in the Fall of 2023 and 9 times in the Spring of 2024.The program has provided more than 36,000 pounds of food through the campus food pantry during 2023-24. Additionally, in Spring 2024, C3 gave out 476 bus passes to 135 students.

The persistence rates for students utilizing C3 are much higher than the average student. The completion rate for C3 students is 97% overall and 93% for Spring 2024. The C3 program was developed in 2016, and services have included support with food insecurity, housing, and other basic needs; child and elder care; transportation and bus passes; counseling and legal services; school supplies; and healthcare. The four most-used services include the food pantry, bus passes, financial resources, and technology resources.







MVCC Holds Community Convening Focused on AI

On Oct. 2, 2024, MVCC held its second annual Community Convening. This year's topic —*Embracing Artificial Intelligence to Promote Human Flourishing*— was explored in an engaging presentation by MVCC President Dr. Randall J. VanWagoner and guest speaker Todd McLees, Co-Founder of HumanSkills.Ai, a company that helps people build the skills to work alongside artificial intelligence.

Al is essential for businesses and communities to stay competitive and innovative. It can transform operations by streamlining processes, increasing efficiency, and driving growth. For businesses, Al can save time and resources and boost productivity. For communities, it can foster sustainable development, advancing the workforce, improving education, and enhancing services that strengthen regional vibrancy.

MVCC — a hub for education, training, and collaboration is a key player in supporting AI adoption, helping businesses understand and apply it effectively through partnerships, workshops, and tailored programs designed to equip the workforce with future-ready skills. McLees said much of the work being done to help integrate Al into the workforce starts with critical thinking at places like MVCC: "The issue is not going to be access for people to the technology itself. It's going to be access to high quality training and that type of training can be delivered through partners like Mohawk Valley Community College."

MVCC Holds Final Ted Moore Run/Walk

The MVCC Foundation, along with the family of late MVCC Mathematics Professor Ted Moore, held the 27th and final Ted Moore Run/Walk on April 25, 2024. The beloved run/walk was created in memory of Theodore "Ted" Moore after he was tragically killed by a drunk driver in December 1996. In addition to raising funds for an MVCC scholarship in Moore's name, the event was co-sponsored by Oneida County STOP-DWI and raised awareness of the dangers of drinking and driving.

As a result of everyone's hard work over the last 27 years, the Theodore "Ted" Moore Memorial Scholarship fund has grown to over \$217,000. This allows the Foundation to leave \$200,000 in the endowment, while the additional \$17,000 will be made available for awarding scholarships. Since the funds are invested, the available balance will continue to gain interest, covering scholarship awards for the foreseeable future. With the approval of the Moore family, the scholarship award has increased for the upcoming year from \$500 to up to four scholarships at \$1,500 each year. The scholarship may be used for tuition.

In lieu of the annual run/walk, the Foundation will honor Moore's memory and raise awareness about the dangers of drinking and driving by sending out an annual email that highlights scholarship recipients and serves as a reminder of Ted's story and its impact on the community.




Angela Marken joined the Institutional Advancement Office in February 2022 as the Assistant to the Office of Institutional Advancement. Marken has a strong background in higher education:
